MIDLERS & JUNIORS - PSALM 51-100 ESV

- Psalm 51:1 Have mercy on me, O God, according to your steadfast love; according to your abundant mercy blot out my transgressions.
- Psalm 51:2 Wash me thoroughly from my iniquity, and cleanse me from my sin!
- Psalm 51:3 For I know my transgressions, and my sin is ever before me.
- Psalm 51:4 Against you, you only, have I sinned and done what is evil in your sight, so that you may be justified in your words and blameless in your judgment.
- Psalm 51:5 Behold, I was brought forth in iniquity, and in sin did my mother conceive me.
- Psalm 51:6 Behold, you delight in truth in the inward being, and you teach me wisdom in the secret heart.
- Psalm 51:7 Purge me with hyssop, and I shall be clean; wash me, and I shall be whiter than snow.
- Psalm 51:8 Let me hear joy and gladness; let the bones that you have broken rejoice.
- Psalm 51:9 Hide your face from my sins, and blot out all my iniquities.
- Psalm 51:10 Create in me a clean heart, O God, and renew a right spirit within me.
- Psalm 51:11 Cast me not away from your presence, and take not your Holy Spirit from me.
- Psalm 51:12 Restore to me the joy of your salvation, and uphold me with a willing spirit.
- Psalm 51:13 Then I will teach transgressors your ways, and sinners will return to you.
- Psalm 51:14 Deliver me from bloodguiltiness, O God, O God of my salvation, and my tongue will sing aloud of your righteousness.
- Psalm 51:15 O Lord, open my lips, and my mouth will declare your praise.
- Psalm 51:16 For you will not delight in sacrifice, or I would give it; you will not be pleased with a burnt offering.
- Psalm 51:17 The sacrifices of God are a broken spirit; a broken and contrite heart, O God, you will not despise.
- Psalm 51:18 Do good to Zion in your good pleasure; build up the walls of Jerusalem;

- Psalm 51:19 then will you delight in right sacrifices, in burnt offerings and whole burnt offerings; then bulls will be offered on your altar.
- Psalm 52:1 Why do you boast of evil, O mighty man? The steadfast love of God endures all the day.
- Psalm 52:2 Your tongue plots destruction, like a sharp razor, you worker of deceit.
- Psalm 52:3 You love evil more than good, and lying more than speaking what is right. Selah
- Psalm 52:4 You love all words that devour, O deceitful tongue.
- Psalm 52:5 But God will break you down forever; he will snatch and tear you from your tent; he will uproot you from the land of the living. Selah
- Psalm 52:6 The righteous shall see and fear, and shall laugh at him, saying,
- Psalm 52:7 "See the man who would not make God his refuge, but trusted in the abundance of his riches and sought refuge in his own destruction!"
- Psalm 52:8 But I am like a green olive tree in the house of God. I trust in the steadfast love of God forever and ever.
- Psalm 52:9 I will thank you forever, because you have done it. I will wait for your name, for it is good, in the presence of the godly.
- Psalm 53:1 The fool says in his heart, "There is no God." They are corrupt, doing abominable iniquity; there is none who does good.
- Psalm 53:2 God looks down from heaven on the children of man to see if there are any who understand, who seek after God.
- Psalm 53:3 They have all fallen away; together they have become corrupt; there is none who does good, not even one.
- Psalm 53:4 Have those who work evil no knowledge, who eat up my people as they eat bread, and do not call upon God?
- Psalm 53:5 There they are, in great terror, where there is no terror! For God scatters the bones of him who encamps against you; you put them to shame, for God has rejected them.
- Psalm 53:6 Oh, that salvation for Israel would come out of Zion! When God restores the fortunes of his people, Let Jacob rejoice, let Israel be glad.
- Psalm 54:1 O God, save me, by your name, and vindicate me by your might.
- Psalm 54:2 O God, hear my prayer; give ear to the words of my mouth.
- Psalm 54:3 For strangers have risen against me; ruthless men seek my life; they do not set God before themselves. Selah
- Psalm 54:4 Behold, God is my helper; the Lord is the upholder of my life.

Psalm 54:5 He will return the evil to my enemies; in your faithfulness put an end to them.

Psalm 54:6 With a freewill offering I will sacrifice to you; I will give thanks to your name, O Lord, for it is good.

Psalm 54:7 For he has delivered me from every trouble, and my eye has looked in triumph on my enemies.

Psalm 55:1 Give ear to my prayer, O God, and hide not yourself from my plea for mercy!

Psalm 55:2 Attend to me, and answer me; I am restless in my complaint and I moan,

Psalm 55:3 because of the noise of the enemy, because of the oppression of the wicked. For they drop trouble upon me, and in anger they bear a grudge against me.

Psalm 55:4 My heart is in anguish within me; the terrors of death have fallen upon me.

Psalm 55:5 Fear and trembling come upon me, and horror overwhelms me.

Psalm 55:6 And I say, "Oh, that I had wings like a dove! I would fly away and be at rest;

Psalm 55:7 yes, I would wander far away; I would lodge in the wilderness; Selah

Psalm 55:8 I would hurry to find a shelter from the raging wind and tempest."

Psalm 55:9 Destroy, O Lord, divide their tongues; for I see violence and strife in the city.

Psalm 55:10 Day and night they go around it on its walls, and iniquity and trouble are within it;

Psalm 55:11 ruin is in its midst; oppression and fraud do not depart from its marketplace.

Psalm 55:12 For it is not an enemy who taunts me- then I could bear it; it is not an adversary who deals insolently with me- then I could hide from him.

Psalm 55:13 But it is you, a man, my equal, my companion, my familiar friend.

Psalm 55:14 We used to take sweet counsel together; within God's house we walked in the throng.

Psalm 55:15 Let death steal over them; let them go down to Sheol alive; for evil is in their dwelling place and in their heart.

Psalm 55:16 But I call to God, and the Lord will save me.

Psalm 55:17 Evening and morning and at noon I utter my complaint and moan, and he hears my voice.

Psalm 55:18 He redeems my soul in safety from the battle that I wage, for many are arrayed against me.

Psalm 55:19 God will give ear and humble them, he who is enthroned from of old, Selah because they do not change and do not fear God.

Psalm 55:20 My companion stretched out his hand against his friends; he violated his covenant.

Psalm 55:21 His speech was smooth as butter, yet war was in his heart; his words were softer than oil, yet they were drawn swords.

Psalm 55:22 Cast your burden on the Lord, and he will sustain you; he will never permit the righteous to be moved.

Psalm 55:23 But you, O God, will cast them down into the pit of destruction; men of blood and treachery shall not live out half their days. But I will trust in you.

Psalm 56:1 Be gracious to me, O God, for man tramples on me; all day long an attacker oppresses me;

Psalm 56:2 my enemies trample on me all day long, for many attack me proudly.

Psalm 56:3 When I am afraid, I put my trust in you.

Psalm 56:4 In God, whose word I praise, in God I trust; I shall not be afraid. What can flesh do to me?

Psalm 56:5 All day long they injure my cause; all their thoughts are against me for evil.

Psalm 56:6 They stir up strife, they lurk; they watch my steps, as they have waited for my life.

Psalm 56:7 For their crime will they escape? In wrath cast down the peoples, O God!

Psalm 56:8 You have kept count of my tossings; put my tears in your bottle. Are they not in your book?

Psalm 56:9 Then my enemies will turn back in the day when I call. This I know, that God is for me.

Psalm 56:10 In God, whose word I praise, in the Lord, whose word I praise,

Psalm 56:11 in God I trust; I shall not be afraid. What can man do to me?

Psalm 56:12 I must perform my vows to you, O God; I will render thank offerings to you.

Psalm 56:13 For you have delivered my soul from death, yes, my feet from falling, that I may walk before God in the light of life.

Psalm 57:1 Be merciful to me, O God, be merciful to me, for in you my soul takes refuge; in the shadow of your wings I will take refuge, till the storms of destruction pass by.

Psalm 57:2 I cry out to God Most High, to God who fulfills his purpose for me.

Psalm 57:3 He will send from heaven and save me; he will put to shame him who tramples on me. Selah God will send out his steadfast love and his faithfulness!

Psalm 57:4 My soul is in the midst of lions; I lie down amid fiery beasts- the children of man, whose teeth are spears and arrows, whose tongues are sharp swords.

Psalm 57:5 Be exalted, O God, above the heavens! Let your glory be over all the earth!

Psalm 57:6 They set a net for my steps; my soul was bowed down. They dug a pit in my way, but they have fallen into it themselves. Selah

Psalm 57:7 My heart is steadfast, O God, my heart is steadfast! I will sing and make melody!

Psalm 57:8 Awake, my glory! Awake, O harp and lyre! I will awake the dawn!

Psalm 57:9 I will give thanks to you, O Lord, among the peoples; I will sing praises to you among the nations.

Psalm 57:10 For your steadfast love is great to the heavens, your faithfulness to the clouds.

Psalm 57:11 Be exalted, O God, above the heavens! Let your glory be over all the earth!

Psalm 58:1 Do you indeed decree what is right, you gods? Do you judge the children of man uprightly?

Psalm 58:2 No, in your hearts you devise wrongs; your hands deal out violence on earth.

Psalm 58:3 The wicked are estranged from the womb; they go astray from birth, speaking lies.

Psalm 58:4 They have venom like the venom of a serpent, like the deaf adder that stops its ear,

Psalm 58:5 so that it does not hear the voice of charmers or of the cunning enchanter.

Psalm 58:6 O God, break the teeth in their mouths; tear out the fangs of the young lions, O Lord!

Psalm 58:7 Let them vanish like water that runs away; when he aims his arrows, let them be blunted.

Psalm 58:8 Let them be like the snail that dissolves into slime, like the stillborn child who never sees the sun.

Psalm 58:9 Sooner than your pots can feel the heat of thorns, whether green or ablaze, may he sweep them away!

Psalm 58:10 The righteous will rejoice when he sees the vengeance; he will bathe his feet in the blood of the wicked.

Psalm 58:11 Mankind will say, "Surely there is a reward for the righteous; surely there is a God who judges on earth."

Psalm 59:1 Deliver me from my enemies, O my God; protect me from those who rise up against me;

Psalm 59:2 deliver me from those who work evil, and save me from bloodthirsty men.

Psalm 59:3 For behold, they lie in wait for my life; fierce men stir up strife against me. For no transgression or sin of mine, O Lord,

Psalm 59:4 for no fault of mine, they run and make ready. Awake, come to meet me, and see!

Psalm 59:5 You, Lord God of hosts, are God of Israel. Rouse yourself to punish all the nations; spare none of those who treacherously plot evil. Selah

Psalm 59:6 Each evening they come back, howling like dogs and prowling about the city.

Psalm 59:7 There they are, bellowing with their mouths with swords in their lips- for "Who," they think, "will hear us?"

Psalm 59:8 But you, O Lord, laugh at them; you hold all the nations in derision.

Psalm 59:9 O my Strength, I will watch for you, for you, O God, are my fortress.

Psalm 59:10 My God in his steadfast love will meet me; God will let me look in triumph on my enemies.

Psalm 59:11 Kill them not, lest my people forget; make them totter by your power and bring them down, O Lord, our shield!

Psalm 59:12 For the sin of their mouths, the words of their lips, let them be trapped in their pride. For the cursing and lies that they utter,

Psalm 59:13 consume them in wrath; consume them till they are no more, that they may know that God rules over Jacob to the ends of the earth. Selah

Psalm 59:14 Each evening they come back, howling like dogs and prowling about the city.

Psalm 59:15 They wander about for food and growl if they do not get their fill.

Psalm 59:16 But I will sing of your strength; I will sing aloud of your steadfast love in the morning. For you have been to me a fortress and a refuge in the day of my distress.

Psalm 59:17 O my Strength, I will sing praises to you, for you, O God, are my fortress, the God who shows me steadfast love.

Psalm 60:1 O God, you have rejected us, broken our defenses; you have been angry; oh, restore us.

Psalm 60:2 You have made the land to quake; you have torn it open; repair its breaches, for it totters.

Psalm 60:3 You have made your people see hard things; you have given us wine to drink that made us stagger.

Psalm 60:4 You have set up a banner for those who fear you, that they may flee to it from the bow. Selah

Psalm 60:5 That your beloved ones may be delivered, give salvation by your right hand and answer us!

Psalm 60:6 God has spoken in his holiness: "With exultation I will divide up Shechem and portion out the Vale of Succoth.

Psalm 60:7 Gilead is mine; Manasseh is mine; Ephraim is my helmet; Judah is my scepter.

Psalm 60:8 Moab is my washbasin; upon Edom I cast my shoe; over Philistia I shout in triumph."

Psalm 60:9 Who will bring me to the fortified city? Who will lead me to Edom?

Psalm 60:10 Have you not rejected us, O God? You do not go forth, O God, with our armies.

Psalm 60:11 Oh, grant us help against the foe, for vain is the salvation of man!

Psalm 60:12 With God we shall do valiantly; it is he who will tread down our foes.

Psalm 61:1 Hear my cry, O God, listen to my prayer;

Psalm 61:2 from the end of the earth I call to you when my heart is faint. Lead me to the rock that is higher than I,

Psalm 61:3 for you have been my refuge, a strong tower against the enemy.

Psalm 61:4 Let me dwell in your tent forever! Let me take refuge under the shelter of your wings! Selah

Psalm 61:5 For you, O God, have heard my vows; you have given me the heritage of those who fear your name.

Psalm 61:6 Prolong the life of the king; may his years endure to all generations!

Psalm 61:7 May he be enthroned forever before God; appoint steadfast love and faithfulness to watch over him!

Psalm 61:8 So will I ever sing praises to your name, as I perform my vows day after day.

Psalm 62:1 For God alone my soul waits in silence; from him comes my salvation.

Psalm 62:2 He only is my rock and my salvation, my fortress; I shall not be greatly shaken.

Psalm 62:3 How long will all of you attack a man to batter him, like a leaning wall, a tottering fence?

Psalm 62:4 They only plan to thrust him down from his high position. They take pleasure in falsehood. They bless with their mouths, but inwardly they curse. Selah

Psalm 62:5 For God alone, O my soul, wait in silence, for my hope is from him.

Psalm 62:6 He only is my rock and my salvation, my fortress; I shall not be shaken.

Psalm 62:7 On God rests my salvation and my glory; my mighty rock, my refuge is God.

Psalm 62:8 Trust in him at all times, O people; pour out your heart before him; God is a refuge for us. Selah

Psalm 62:9 Those of low estate are but a breath; those of high estate are a delusion; in the balances they go up; they are together lighter than a breath.

Psalm 62:10 Put no trust in extortion; set no vain hopes on robbery; if riches increase, set not your heart on them.

Psalm 62:11 Once God has spoken; twice have I heard this: that power belongs to God,

Psalm 62:12 and that to you, O Lord, belongs steadfast love. For you will render to a man according to his work.

Psalm 63:1 O God, you are my God; earnestly I seek you; my soul thirsts for you; my flesh faints for you, as in a dry and weary land where there is no water.

Psalm 63:2 So I have looked upon you in the sanctuary, beholding your power and glory.

Psalm 63:3 Because your steadfast love is better than life, my lips will praise you.

Psalm 63:4 So I will bless you as long as I live; in your name I will lift up my hands.

Psalm 63:5 My soul will be satisfied as with fat and rich food, and my mouth will praise you with joyful lips,

Psalm 63:6 when I remember you upon my bed, and meditate on you in the watches of the night;

Psalm 63:7 for you have been my help, and in the shadow of your wings I will sing for joy.

Psalm 63:8 My soul clings to you; your right hand upholds me.

Psalm 63:9 But those who seek to destroy my life shall go down into the depths of the earth;

Psalm 63:10 they shall be given over to the power of the sword; they shall be a portion for jackals.

Psalm 63:11 But the king shall rejoice in God; all who swear by him shall exult, for the mouths of liars will be stopped.

Psalm 64:1 Hear my voice, O God, in my complaint; preserve my life from dread of the enemy.

Psalm 64:2 Hide me from the secret plots of the wicked, from the throng of evildoers,

Psalm 64:3 who whet their tongues like swords, who aim bitter words like arrows,

Psalm 64:4 shooting from ambush at the blameless, shooting at him suddenly and without fear.

Psalm 64:5 They hold fast to their evil purpose; they talk of laying snares secretly, thinking, who can see them?

Psalm 64:6 They search out injustice, saying, "We have accomplished a diligent search." For the inward mind and heart of a man are deep!

Psalm 64:7 But God shoots his arrow at them; they are wounded suddenly.

Psalm 64:8 They are brought to ruin, with their own tongues turned against them; all who see them will wag their heads.

Psalm 64:9 Then all mankind fears; they tell what God has brought about and ponder what he has done.

Psalm 64:10 Let the righteous one rejoice in the Lord and take refuge in him! Let all the upright in heart exult!

Psalm 65:1 Praise is due to you, O God, in Zion, and to you shall vows be performed.

Psalm 65:2 O you who hears prayer, to you shall all flesh come.

Psalm 65:3 When iniquities prevail against me, you atone for our transgressions.

Psalm 65:4 Blessed is the one you choose and bring near, to dwell in your courts! We shall be satisfied with the goodness of your house, the holiness of your temple!

Psalm 65:5 By awesome deeds you answer us with righteousness, O God of our salvation, the hope of all the ends of the earth and of the farthest seas;

Psalm 65:6 the one who by his strength established the mountains, being girded with might;

Psalm 65:7 who stills the roaring of the seas, the roaring of their waves, the tumult of the peoples,

- Psalm 65:8 so that those who dwell at the ends of the earth are in awe at your signs. You make the going out of the morning and the evening to shout for joy.
- Psalm 65:9 You visit the earth and water it; you greatly enrich it; the river of God is full of water; you provide their grain, for so you have prepared it.
- Psalm 65:10 You water its furrows abundantly, settling its ridges, softening it with showers, and blessing its growth.
- Psalm 65:11 You crown the year with your bounty; your wagon tracks overflow with abundance.
- Psalm 65:12 The pastures of the wilderness overflow, the hills gird themselves with joy,
- Psalm 65:13 the meadows clothe themselves with flocks, the valleys deck themselves with grain, they shout and sing together for joy.
- Psalm 66:1 Shout for joy to God, all the earth;
- Psalm 66:2 sing the glory of his name; give to him glorious praise!
- Psalm 66:3 Say to God, "How awesome are your deeds! So great is your power that your enemies come cringing to you.
- Psalm 66:4 All the earth worships you and sings praises to you; they sing praises to your name." Selah
- Psalm 66:5 Come and see what God has done: he is awesome in his deeds toward the children of man.
- Psalm 66:6 He turned the sea into dry land; they passed through the river on foot. There did we rejoice in him,
- Psalm 66:7 who rules by his might forever, whose eyes keep watch on the nations- let not the rebellious exalt themselves. Selah
- Psalm 66:8 Bless our God, O peoples; let the sound of his praise be heard,
- Psalm 66:9 who has kept our soul among the living and has not let our feet slip.
- Psalm 66:10 For you, O God, have tested us; you have tried us as silver is tried.
- Psalm 66:11 You brought us into the net; you laid a crushing burden on our backs;
- Psalm 66:12 you let men ride over our heads; we went through fire and through water; yet you have brought us out to a place of abundance.
- Psalm 66:13 I will come into your house with burnt offerings; I will perform my vows to you,
- Psalm 66:14 that which my lips uttered and my mouth promised when I was in trouble.
- Psalm 66:15 I will offer to you burnt offerings of fattened animals, with the smoke of the sacrifice of rams; I will make an offering of bulls and goats. Selah
- Psalm 66:16 Come and hear, all you who fear God, and I will tell what he has done for my soul.

Psalm 66:17 I cried to him with my mouth, and high praise was on my tongue.

Psalm 66:18 If I had cherished iniquity in my heart, the Lord would not have listened.

Psalm 66:19 But truly God has listened; he has attended to the voice of my prayer.

Psalm 66:20 Blessed be God, because he has not rejected my prayer or removed his steadfast love from me!

Psalm 67:1 May God be gracious to us and bless us and make his face to shine upon us, Selah

Psalm 67:2 that your way may be known on earth, your saving power among all nations.

Psalm 67:3 Let the peoples praise you, O God; let all the peoples praise you!

Psalm 67:4 Let the nations be glad and sing for joy, for you judge the peoples with equity and guide the nations upon earth. Selah

Psalm 67:5 Let the peoples praise you, O God; let all the peoples praise you!

Psalm 67:6 The earth has yielded its increase; God, our God, shall bless us.

Psalm 67:7 God shall bless us; let all the ends of the earth fear him!

Psalm 68:1 God shall arise, his enemies shall be scattered; and those who hate him shall flee before him!

Psalm 68:2 As smoke is driven away, so you shall drive them away; as wax melts before fire, so the wicked shall perish before God!

Psalm 68:3 But the righteous shall be glad; they shall exult before God; they shall be jubilant with joy!

Psalm 68:4 Sing to God, sing praises to his name; lift up a song to him who rides through the deserts; his name is the Lord; exult before him!

Psalm 68:5 Father of the fatherless and protector of widows is God in his holy habitation.

Psalm 68:6 God settles the solitary in a home; he leads out the prisoners to prosperity, but the rebellious dwell in a parched land.

Psalm 68:7 O God, when you went out before your people, when you marched through the wilderness, Selah

Psalm 68:8 the earth quaked, the heavens poured down rain, before God, the One of Sinai, before God, the God of Israel.

Psalm 68:9 Rain in abundance, O God, you shed abroad; you restored your inheritance as it languished;

Psalm 68:10 your flock found a dwelling in it; in your goodness, O God, you provided for the needy.

Psalm 68:11 The Lord gives the word; the women who announce the news are a great host:

Psalm 68:12 "The kings of the armies- they flee, they flee!" The women at home divide the spoil-

Psalm 68:13 though you men lie among the sheepfolds- the wings of a dove covered with silver, its pinions with shimmering gold.

Psalm 68:14 When the Almighty scatters kings there, let snow fall on Zalmon.

Psalm 68:15 O mountain of God, mountain of Bashan; O many-peaked mountain, mountain of Bashan!

Psalm 68:16 Why do you look with hatred, O many-peaked mountain, at the mount that God desired for his abode, yes, where the Lord will dwell forever?

Psalm 68:17 The chariots of God are twice ten thousand, thousands upon thousands; the Lord is among them; Sinai is now in the sanctuary.

Psalm 68:18 You ascended on high, leading a host of captives in your train and receiving gifts among men, even among the rebellious, that the Lord God may dwell there.

Psalm 68:19 Blessed be the Lord, who daily bears us up; God is our salvation. Selah

Psalm 68:20 Our God is a God of salvation, and to GOD, the Lord, belong deliverances from death.

Psalm 68:21 But God will strike the heads of his enemies, the hairy crown of him who walks in his guilty ways.

Psalm 68:22 The Lord said, "I will bring them back from Bashan, I will bring them back from the depths of the sea,

Psalm 68:23 that you may strike your feet in their blood, that the tongues of your dogs may have their portion from the foe."

Psalm 68:24 Your procession is seen, O God, the procession of my God, my King, into the sanctuary-

Psalm 68:25 the singers in front, the musicians last, between them virgins playing tambourines:

Psalm 68:26 "Bless God in the great congregation, the Lord, O you who are of Israel's fountain!"

Psalm 68:27 There is Benjamin, the least of them, in the lead, the princes of Judah in their throng, the princes of Zebulun, the princes of Naphtali.

Psalm 68:28 Summon your power, O God, the power, O God, by which you have worked for us.

Psalm 68:29 Because of your temple at Jerusalem kings shall bear gifts to you.

Psalm 68:30 Rebuke the beasts that dwell among the reeds, the herd of bulls with the calves of the peoples. Trample underfoot those who lust after tribute; scatter the peoples who delight in war.

Psalm 68:31 Nobles shall come from Egypt; Cush shall hasten to stretch out her hands to God.

Psalm 68:32 O kingdoms of the earth, sing to God; sing praises to the Lord, Selah

Psalm 68:33 to him who rides in the heavens, the ancient heavens; behold, he sends out his voice, his mighty voice.

Psalm 68:34 Ascribe power to God, whose majesty is over Israel, and whose power is in the skies.

Psalm 68:35 Awesome is God from his sanctuary; the God of Israel- he is the one who gives power and strength to his people. Blessed be God!

Psalm 69:1 Save me, O God! For the waters have come up to my neck.

Psalm 69:2 I sink in deep mire, where there is no foothold; I have come into deep waters, and the flood sweeps over me.

Psalm 69:3 I am weary with my crying out; my throat is parched. My eyes grow dim with waiting for my God.

Psalm 69:4 More in number than the hairs of my head are those who hate me without cause; mighty are those who would destroy me, those who attack me with lies. What I did not steal must I now restore?

Psalm 69:5 O God, you know my folly; the wrongs I have done are not hidden from you.

Psalm 69:6 Let not those who hope in you be put to shame through me, O Lord GOD of hosts; let not those who seek you be brought to dishonor through me, O God of Israel.

Psalm 69:7 For it is for your sake that I have borne reproach, that dishonor has covered my face.

Psalm 69:8 I have become a stranger to my brothers, an alien to my mother's sons.

Psalm 69:9 For zeal for your house has consumed me, and the reproaches of those who reproach you have fallen on me.

Psalm 69:10 When I wept and humbled my soul with fasting, it became my reproach.

Psalm 69:11 When I made sackcloth my clothing, I became a byword to them.

Psalm 69:12 I am the talk of those who sit in the gate, and the drunkards make songs about me.

Psalm 69:13 But as for me, my prayer is to you, O Lord. At an acceptable time, O God, in the abundance of your steadfast love answer me in your saving faithfulness.

Psalm 69:14 Deliver me from sinking in the mire; let me be delivered from my enemies and from the deep waters.

Psalm 69:15 Let not the flood sweep over me, or the deep swallow me up, or the pit close its mouth over me.

Psalm 69:16 Answer me, O Lord, for your steadfast love is good; according to your abundant mercy, turn to me.

Psalm 69:17 Hide not your face from your servant; for I am in distress; make haste to answer me.

Psalm 69:18 Draw near to my soul, redeem me; ransom me because of my enemies!

Psalm 69:19 You know my reproach, and my shame and my dishonor; my foes are all known to you.

Psalm 69:20 Reproaches have broken my heart, so that I am in despair. I looked for pity, but there was none, and for comforters, but I found none.

Psalm 69:21 They gave me poison for food, and for my thirst they gave me sour wine to drink.

Psalm 69:22 Let their own table before them become a snare; and when they are at peace, let it become a trap.

Psalm 69:23 Let their eyes be darkened, so that they cannot see, and make their loins tremble continually.

Psalm 69:24 Pour out your indignation upon them, and let your burning anger overtake them.

Psalm 69:25 May their camp be a desolation; let no one dwell in their tents.

Psalm 69:26 For they persecute him whom you have struck down, and they recount the pain of those you have wounded.

Psalm 69:27 Add to them punishment upon punishment; may they have no acquittal from you.

Psalm 69:28 Let them be blotted out of the book of the living; let them not be enrolled among the righteous.

Psalm 69:29 But I am afflicted and in pain; let your salvation, O God, set me on high!

Psalm 69:30 I will praise the name of God with a song; I will magnify him with thanksgiving.

Psalm 69:31 This will please the Lord more than an ox or a bull with horns and hoofs.

Psalm 69:32 When the humble see it they will be glad; you who seek God, let your hearts revive.

Psalm 69:33 For the Lord hears the needy and does not despise his own people who are prisoners.

Psalm 69:34 Let heaven and earth praise him, the seas and everything that moves in them.

Psalm 69:35 For God will save Zion and build up the cities of Judah, and people shall dwell there and possess it;

Psalm 69:36 the offspring of his servants shall inherit it, and those who love his name shall dwell in it.

Psalm 70:1 Make haste, O God, to deliver me! O Lord, make haste to help me!

Psalm 70:2 Let them be put to shame and confusion who seek my life! Let them be turned back and brought to dishonor who desire my hurt!

Psalm 70:3 Let them turn back because of their shame who say, "Aha, Aha!"

Psalm 70:4 May all who seek you rejoice and be glad in you! May those who love your salvation say evermore, "God is great!"

Psalm 70:5 But I am poor and needy; hasten to me, O God! You are my help and my deliverer; O Lord, do not delay!

Psalm 71:1 In you, O Lord, do I take refuge; let me never be put to shame!

Psalm 71:2 In your righteousness deliver me and rescue me; incline your ear to me, and save me!

Psalm 71:3 Be to me a rock of refuge, to which I may continually come; you have given the command to save me, for you are my rock and my fortress.

Psalm 71:4 Rescue me, O my God, from the hand of the wicked, from the grasp of the unjust and cruel man.

Psalm 71:5 For you, O Lord, are my hope, my trust, O Lord, from my youth.

Psalm 71:6 Upon you I have leaned from before my birth; you are he who took me from my mother's womb. My praise is continually of you.

Psalm 71:7 I have been as a portent to many, but you are my strong refuge.

Psalm 71:8 My mouth is filled with your praise, and with your glory all the day.

Psalm 71:9 Do not cast me off in the time of old age; forsake me not when my strength is spent.

Psalm 71:10 For my enemies speak concerning me; those who watch for my life consult together

Psalm 71:11 and say, "God has forsaken him; pursue and seize him, for there is none to deliver him."

Psalm 71:12 O God, be not far from me; O my God, make haste to help me!

Psalm 71:13 May my accusers be put to shame and consumed; with scorn and disgrace may they be covered who seek my hurt.

Psalm 71:14 But I will hope continually and will praise you yet more and more.

Psalm 71:15 My mouth will tell of your righteous acts, of your deeds of salvation all the day, for their number is past my knowledge.

Psalm 71:16 With the mighty deeds of the Lord GOD I will come; I will remind them of your righteousness, yours alone.

Psalm 71:17 O God, from my youth you have taught me, and I still proclaim your wondrous deeds.

Psalm 71:18 So even to old age and gray hairs, O God, do not forsake me, until I proclaim your might to another generation, your power to all those to come.

Psalm 71:19 Your righteousness, O God, reaches the high heavens. You who have done great things, O God, who is like you?

Psalm 71:20 You who have made me see many troubles and calamities will revive me again; from the depths of the earth you will bring me up again.

Psalm 71:21 You will increase my greatness and comfort me again.

Psalm 71:22 I will also praise you with the harp for your faithfulness, O my God; I will sing praises to you with the lyre, O Holy One of Israel.

Psalm 71:23 My lips will shout for joy, when I sing praises to you; my soul also, which you have redeemed.

Psalm 71:24 And my tongue will talk of your righteous help all the day long, for they have been put to shame and disappointed who sought to do me hurt.

Psalm 72:1 Give the king your justice, O God, and your righteousness to the royal son!

Psalm 72:2 May he judge your people with righteousness, and your poor with justice!

Psalm 72:3 Let the mountains bear prosperity for the people, and the hills, in righteousness!

- Psalm 72:4 May he defend the cause of the poor of the people, give deliverance to the children of the needy, and crush the oppressor!
- Psalm 72:5 May they fear you while the sun endures, and as long as the moon, throughout all generations!
- Psalm 72:6 May he be like rain that falls on the mown grass, like showers that water the earth!
- Psalm 72:7 In his days may the righteous flourish, and peace abound, till the moon be no more!
- Psalm 72:8 May he have dominion from sea to sea, and from the River to the ends of the earth!
- Psalm 72:9 May desert tribes bow down before him and his enemies lick the dust!
- Psalm 72:10 May the kings of Tarshish and of the coastlands render him tribute; may the kings of Sheba and Seba bring gifts!
- Psalm 72:11 May all kings fall down before him, all nations serve him!
- Psalm 72:12 For he delivers the needy when he calls, the poor and him who has no helper.
- Psalm 72:13 He has pity on the weak and the needy, and saves the lives of the needy.
- Psalm 72:14 From oppression and violence he redeems their life, and precious is their blood in his sight.
- Psalm 72:15 Long may he live; may gold of Sheba be given to him! May prayer be made for him continually, and blessings invoked for him all the day!
- Psalm 72:16 May there be abundance of grain in the land; on the tops of the mountains may it wave; may its fruit be like Lebanon; and may people blossom in the cities like the grass of the field!
- Psalm 72:17 May his name endure forever, his fame continue as long as the sun! May people be blessed in him, all nations call him blessed!
- Psalm 72:18 Blessed be the Lord, the God of Israel, who alone does wondrous things.
- Psalm 72:19 Blessed be his glorious name forever; may the whole earth be filled with his glory! Amen and Amen!
- Psalm 72:20 The prayers of David, the son of Jesse, are ended.
- Psalm 73:1 Truly God is good to Israel, to those who are pure in heart.
- Psalm 73:2 But as for me, my feet had almost stumbled, my steps had nearly slipped.
- Psalm 73:3 For I was envious of the arrogant when I saw the prosperity of the wicked.
- Psalm 73:4 For they have no pangs until death; their bodies are fat and sleek.
- Psalm 73:5 They are not in trouble as others are; they are not stricken like the rest of mankind.
- Psalm 73:6 Therefore pride is their necklace; violence covers them as a garment.

Psalm 73:7 Their eyes swell out through fatness; their hearts overflow with follies.

Psalm 73:8 They scoff and speak with malice; loftily they threaten oppression.

Psalm 73:9 They set their mouths against the heavens, and their tongue struts through the earth.

Psalm 73:10 Therefore his people turn back to them, and find no fault in them.

Psalm 73:11 And they say, "How can God know? Is there knowledge in the Most High?"

Psalm 73:12 Behold, these are the wicked; always at ease, they increase in riches.

Psalm 73:13 All in vain have I kept my heart clean and washed my hands in innocence.

Psalm 73:14 For all the day long I have been stricken and rebuked every morning.

Psalm 73:15 If I had said, "I will speak thus," I would have betrayed the generation of your children.

Psalm 73:16 But when I thought how to understand this, it seemed to me a wearisome task,

Psalm 73:17 until I went into the sanctuary of God; then I discerned their end.

Psalm 73:18 Truly you set them in slippery places; you make them fall to ruin.

Psalm 73:19 How they are destroyed in a moment, swept away utterly by terrors!

Psalm 73:20 Like a dream when one awakes, O Lord, when you rouse yourself, you despise them as phantoms.

Psalm 73:21 When my soul was embittered, when I was pricked in heart,

Psalm 73:22 I was brutish and ignorant; I was like a beast toward you.

Psalm 73:23 Nevertheless, I am continually with you; you hold my right hand.

Psalm 73:24 You guide me with your counsel, and afterward you will receive me to glory.

Psalm 73:25 Whom have I in heaven but you? And there is nothing on earth that I desire besides you.

Psalm 73:26 My flesh and my heart may fail, but God is the strength of my heart and my portion forever.

Psalm 73:27 For behold, those who are far from you shall perish; you put an end to everyone who is unfaithful to you.

Psalm 73:28 But for me it is good to be near God; I have made the Lord GOD my refuge, that I may tell of all your works.

Psalm 74:1 O God, why do you cast us off forever? Why does your anger smoke against the sheep of your pasture?

Psalm 74:2 Remember your congregation, which you have purchased of old, which you have redeemed to be the tribe of your heritage! Remember Mount Zion, where you have dwelt.

Psalm 74:3 Direct your steps to the perpetual ruins; the enemy has destroyed everything in the sanctuary!

Psalm 74:4 Your foes have roared in the midst of your meeting place; they set up their own signs for signs.

Psalm 74:5 They were like those who swing axes in a forest of trees.

Psalm 74:6 And all its carved wood they broke down with hatchets and hammers.

Psalm 74:7 They set your sanctuary on fire; they profaned the dwelling place of your name, bringing it down to the ground.

Psalm 74:8 They said to themselves, "We will utterly subdue them"; they burned all the meeting places of God in the land.

Psalm 74:9 We do not see our signs; there is no longer any prophet, and there is none among us who knows how long.

Psalm 74:10 How long, O God, is the foe to scoff? Is the enemy to revile your name forever?

Psalm 74:11 Why do you hold back your hand, your right hand? Take it from the fold of your garment and destroy them!

Psalm 74:12 Yet God my King is from of old, working salvation in the midst of the earth.

Psalm 74:13 You divided the sea by your might; you broke the heads of the sea monsters on the waters.

Psalm 74:14 You crushed the heads of Leviathan; you gave him as food for the creatures of the wilderness.

Psalm 74:15 You split open springs and brooks; you dried up ever-flowing streams.

Psalm 74:16 Yours is the day, yours also the night; you have established the heavenly lights and the sun.

Psalm 74:17 You have fixed all the boundaries of the earth; you have made summer and winter.

Psalm 74:18 Remember this, O Lord, how the enemy scoffs, and a foolish people reviles your name.

Psalm 74:19 Do not deliver the soul of your dove to the wild beasts; do not forget the life of your poor forever.

Psalm 74:20 Have regard for the covenant, for the dark places of the land are full of the habitations of violence.

Psalm 74:21 Let not the downtrodden turn back in shame; let the poor and needy praise your name.

Psalm 74:22 Arise, O God, defend your cause; remember how the foolish scoff at you all the day!

Psalm 74:23 Do not forget the clamor of your foes, the uproar of those who rise against you, which goes up continually!

Psalm 75:1 We give thanks to you, O God; we give thanks, for your name is near. We recount your wondrous deeds.

Psalm 75:2 "At the set time that I appoint I will judge with equity.

Psalm 75:3 When the earth totters, and all its inhabitants, it is I who keep steady its pillars. Selah

Psalm 75:4 I say to the boastful, 'Do not boast,' and to the wicked, 'Do not lift up your horn;

Psalm 75:5 do not lift up your horn on high, or speak with haughty neck."

Psalm 75:6 For not from the east or from the west and not from the wilderness comes lifting up,

Psalm 75:7 but it is God who executes judgment, putting down one and lifting up another.

Psalm 75:8 For in the hand of the Lord there is a cup with foaming wine, well mixed, and he pours out from it, and all the wicked of the earth shall drain it down to the dregs.

Psalm 75:9 But I will declare it forever; I will sing praises to the God of Jacob.

Psalm 75:10 All the horns of the wicked I will cut off, but the horns of the righteous shall be lifted up.

Psalm 76:1 In Judah God is known; his name is great in Israel.

Psalm 76:2 His abode has been established in Salem, his dwelling place in Zion.

Psalm 76:3 There he broke the flashing arrows, the shield, the sword, and the weapons of war. Selah

Psalm 76:4 Glorious are you, more majestic than the mountains of prey.

Psalm 76:5 The stouthearted were stripped of their spoil; they sank into sleep; all the men of war were unable to use their hands.

Psalm 76:6 At your rebuke, O God of Jacob, both rider and horse lay stunned.

Psalm 76:7 But you, you are to be feared! Who can stand before you when once your anger is roused?

Psalm 76:8 From the heavens you uttered judgment; the earth feared and was still,

Psalm 76:9 when God arose to establish judgment, to save all the humble of the earth. Selah

Psalm 76:10 Surely the wrath of man shall praise you; the remnant of wrath you will put on like a belt.

Psalm 76:11 Make your vows to the Lord your God and perform them; let all around him bring gifts to him who is to be feared,

Psalm 76:12 who cuts off the spirit of princes, who is to be feared by the kings of the earth.

Psalm 77:1 I cry aloud to God, aloud to God, and he will hear me.

Psalm 77:2 In the day of my trouble I seek the Lord; in the night my hand is stretched out without wearying; my soul refuses to be comforted.

Psalm 77:3 When I remember God, I moan; when I meditate, my spirit faints. Selah

Psalm 77:4 You hold my eyelids open; I am so troubled that I cannot speak.

Psalm 77:5 I consider the days of old, the years long ago.

Psalm 77:6 I said, "Let me remember my song in the night; let me meditate in my heart." Then my spirit made a diligent search:

Psalm 77:7 "Will the Lord spurn forever, and never again be favorable?

Psalm 77:8 Has his steadfast love forever ceased? Are his promises at an end for all time?

Psalm 77:9 Has God forgotten to be gracious? Has he in anger shut up his compassion?" Selah

Psalm 77:10 Then I said, "I will appeal to this, to the years of the right hand of the Most High."

Psalm 77:11 I will remember the deeds of the Lord; yes, I will remember your wonders of old.

Psalm 77:12 I will ponder all your work, and meditate on your mighty deeds.

Psalm 77:13 Your way, O God, is holy. What god is great like our God?

Psalm 77:14 You are the God who works wonders; you have made known your might among the peoples.

Psalm 77:15 You with your arm redeemed your people, the children of Jacob and Joseph. Selah

Psalm 77:16 When the waters saw you, O God, when the waters saw you, they were afraid; indeed, the deep trembled.

Psalm 77:17 The clouds poured out water; the skies gave forth thunder; your arrows flashed on every side.

Psalm 77:18 The crash of your thunder was in the whirlwind; your lightnings lighted up the world; the earth trembled and shook.

Psalm 77:19 Your way was through the sea, your path through the great waters; yet your footprints were unseen.

Psalm 77:20 You led your people like a flock by the hand of Moses and Aaron.

Psalm 78:1 Give ear, O my people, to my teaching; incline your ears to the words of my mouth!

Psalm 78:2 I will open my mouth in a parable; I will utter dark sayings from of old,

Psalm 78:3 things that we have heard and known, that our fathers have told us.

Psalm 78:4 We will not hide them from their children, but tell to the coming generation the glorious deeds of the Lord, and his might, and the wonders that he has done.

Psalm 78:5 He established a testimony in Jacob and appointed a law in Israel, which he commanded our fathers to teach to their children,

Psalm 78:6 that the next generation might know them, the children yet unborn, and arise and tell them to their children,

Psalm 78:7 so that they should set their hope in God and not forget the works of God, but keep his commandments;

Psalm 78:8 and that they should not be like their fathers, a stubborn and rebellious generation, a generation whose heart was not steadfast, whose spirit was not faithful to God.

Psalm 78:9 The Ephraimites, armed with the bow, turned back on the day of battle.

Psalm 78:10 They did not keep God's covenant, but refused to walk according to his law.

Psalm 78:11 They forgot his works and the wonders that he had shown them.

Psalm 78:12 In the sight of their fathers he performed wonders in the land of Egypt, in the fields of Zoan.

Psalm 78:13 He divided the sea and let them pass through it, and made the waters stand like a heap.

Psalm 78:14 In the daytime he led them with a cloud, and all the night with a fiery light.

Psalm 78:15 He split rocks in the wilderness and gave them drink abundantly as from the deep.

Psalm 78:16 He made streams come out of the rock and caused waters to flow down like rivers.

Psalm 78:17 Yet they sinned still more against him, rebelling against the Most High in the desert.

Psalm 78:18 They tested God in their heart by demanding the food they craved.

Psalm 78:19 They spoke against God, saying, "Can God spread a table in the wilderness?"

Psalm 78:20 He struck the rock so that water gushed out and streams overflowed. Can he also give bread or provide meat for his people?"

Psalm 78:21 Therefore, when the Lord heard, he was full of wrath; a fire was kindled against Jacob; his anger rose against Israel,

Psalm 78:22 because they did not believe in God and did not trust his saving power.

Psalm 78:23 Yet he commanded the skies above and opened the doors of heaven,

Psalm 78:24 and he rained down on them manna to eat and gave them the grain of heaven.

Psalm 78:25 Man ate of the bread of the angels; he sent them food in abundance.

Psalm 78:26 He caused the east wind to blow in the heavens, and by his power he led out the south wind;

Psalm 78:27 he rained meat on them like dust, winged birds like the sand of the seas;

Psalm 78:28 he let them fall in the midst of their camp, all around their dwellings.

Psalm 78:29 And they ate and were well filled, for he gave them what they craved.

Psalm 78:30 But before they had satisfied their craving, while the food was still in their mouths,

Psalm 78:31 the anger of God rose against them, and he killed the strongest of them and laid low the young men of Israel.

Psalm 78:32 In spite of all this, they still sinned; despite his wonders, they did not believe.

Psalm 78:33 So he made their days vanish like a breath, and their years in terror.

Psalm 78:34 When he killed them, they sought him; they repented and sought God earnestly.

Psalm 78:35 They remembered that God was their rock, the Most High God their redeemer.

Psalm 78:36 But they flattered him with their mouths; they lied to him with their tongues.

Psalm 78:37 Their heart was not steadfast toward him; they were not faithful to his covenant.

Psalm 78:38 Yet he, being compassionate, atoned for their iniquity and did not destroy them; he restrained his anger often and did not stir up all his wrath.

Psalm 78:39 He remembered that they were but flesh, a wind that passes and comes not again.

Psalm 78:40 How often they rebelled against him in the wilderness and grieved him in the desert!

Psalm 78:41 They tested God again and again and provoked the Holy One of Israel.

Psalm 78:42 They did not remember his power or the day when he redeemed them from the foe,

Psalm 78:43 when he performed his signs in Egypt and his marvels in the fields of Zoan.

Psalm 78:44 He turned their rivers to blood, so that they could not drink of their streams.

Psalm 78:45 He sent among them swarms of flies, which devoured them, and frogs, which destroyed them.

Psalm 78:46 He gave their crops to the destroying locust and the fruit of their labor to the locust.

Psalm 78:47 He destroyed their vines with hail and their sycamores with frost.

Psalm 78:48 He gave over their cattle to the hail and their flocks to thunderbolts.

Psalm 78:49 He let loose on them his burning anger, wrath, indignation, and distress, a company of destroying angels.

Psalm 78:50 He made a path for his anger; he did not spare them from death, but gave their lives over to the plague.

Psalm 78:51 He struck down every firstborn in Egypt, the firstfruits of their strength in the tents of Ham.

Psalm 78:52 Then he led out his people like sheep and guided them in the wilderness like a flock.

Psalm 78:53 He led them in safety, so that they were not afraid, but the sea overwhelmed their enemies.

Psalm 78:54 And he brought them to his holy land, to the mountain which his right hand had won.

Psalm 78:55 He drove out nations before them; he apportioned them for a possession and settled the tribes of Israel in their tents.

Psalm 78:56 Yet they tested and rebelled against the Most High God and did not keep his testimonies,
Psalm 78:57 but turned away and acted treacherously like their fathers; they twisted like a deceitful bow.
Psalm 78:58 For they provoked him to anger with their high places; they moved him to jealousy with their idols.
Psalm 78:59 When God heard, he was full of wrath, and he utterly rejected Israel.
Psalm 78:60 He forsook his dwelling at Shiloh, the tent where he dwelt among mankind,
Psalm 78:61 and delivered his power to captivity, his glory to the hand of the foe.
Psalm 78:62 He gave his people over to the sword and vented his wrath on his heritage.
Psalm 78:63 Fire devoured their young men, and their young women had no marriage song.
Psalm 78:64 Their priests fell by the sword, and their widows made no lamentation.
Psalm 78:65 Then the Lord awoke as from sleep, like a strong man shouting because of wine.
Psalm 78:66 And he put his adversaries to rout; he put them to everlasting shame.
Psalm 78:67 He rejected the tent of Joseph; he did not choose the tribe of Ephraim,
Psalm 78:68 but he chose the tribe of Judah, Mount Zion, which he loves.
Psalm 78:69 He built his sanctuary like the high heavens, like the earth, which he has founded forever.
Psalm 78:70 He chose David his servant and took him from the sheepfolds;
Psalm 78:71 from following the nursing ewes he brought him to shepherd Jacob his people, Israel his inheritance.
Psalm 78:72 With upright heart he shepherded them and guided them with his skillful hand.
Psalm 79:1 O God, the nations have come into your inheritance; they have defiled your holy temple; they have laid Jerusalem in ruins.
Psalm 79:2 They have given the bodies of your servants to the birds of the heavens for food, the flesh of your faithful to the beasts of the earth.
Psalm 79:3 They have poured out their blood like water all around Jerusalem, and there was no one to bury them.
Psalm 79:4 We have become a taunt to our neighbors, mocked and derided by those around us.
Psalm 79:5 How long, O Lord? Will you be angry forever? Will your jealousy burn like fire?
Psalm 79:6 Pour out your anger on the nations that do not know you, and on the kingdoms that do not call upon your name!
Psalm 79:7 For they have devoured Jacob and laid waste his habitation.

- Psalm 79:8 Do not remember against us our former iniquities; let your compassion come speedily to meet us, for we are brought very low.
- Psalm 79:9 Help us, O God of our salvation, for the glory of your name; deliver us, and atone for our sins, for your name's sake!
- Psalm 79:10 Why should the nations say, "Where is their God?" Let the avenging of the outpoured blood of your servants be known among the nations before our eyes!
- Psalm 79:11 Let the groans of the prisoners come before you; according to your great power, preserve those doomed to die!
- Psalm 79:12 Return sevenfold into the lap of our neighbors the taunts with which they have taunted you, O Lord!
- Psalm 79:13 But we your people, the sheep of your pasture, will give thanks to you forever; from generation to generation we will recount your praise.
- Psalm 80:1 Give ear, O Shepherd of Israel, you who lead Joseph like a flock! You who are enthroned upon the cherubim, shine forth.
- Psalm 80:2 Before Ephraim and Benjamin and Manasseh, stir up your might and come to save us!
- Psalm 80:3 Restore us, O God; let your face shine, that we may be saved!
- Psalm 80:4 O Lord God of hosts, how long will you be angry with your people's prayers?
- Psalm 80:5 You have fed them with the bread of tears and given them tears to drink in full measure.
- Psalm 80:6 You make us an object of contention for our neighbors, and our enemies laugh among themselves.
- Psalm 80:7 Restore us, O God of hosts; let your face shine, that we may be saved!
- Psalm 80:8 You brought a vine out of Egypt; you drove out the nations and planted it.
- Psalm 80:9 You cleared the ground for it; it took deep root and filled the land.
- Psalm 80:10 The mountains were covered with its shade, the mighty cedars with its branches.
- Psalm 80:11 It sent out its branches to the sea and its shoots to the River.
- Psalm 80:12 Why then have you broken down its walls, so that all who pass along the way pluck its fruit?
- Psalm 80:13 The boar from the forest ravages it, and all that move in the field feed on it.
- Psalm 80:14 Turn again, O God of hosts! Look down from heaven, and see; have regard for this vine,
- Psalm 80:15 the stock that your right hand planted, and for the son whom you made strong for yourself.
- Psalm 80:16 They have burned it with fire; they have cut it down; may they perish at the rebuke of your face!
- Psalm 80:17 But let your hand be on the man of your right hand, the son of man whom you have made strong for yourself!

Psalm 80:18 Then we shall not turn back from you; give us life, and we will call upon your name!

Psalm 80:19 Restore us, O Lord God of hosts! let your face shine, that we may be saved!

Psalm 81:1 Sing aloud to God our strength; shout for joy to the God of Jacob!

Psalm 81:2 Raise a song; sound the tambourine, the sweet lyre with the harp.

Psalm 81:3 Blow the trumpet at the new moon, at the full moon, on our feast day.

Psalm 81:4 For it is a statute for Israel, a rule of the God of Jacob.

Psalm 81:5 He made it a decree in Joseph when he went out over the land of Egypt. I hear a language I had not known:

Psalm 81:6 "I relieved your shoulder of the burden; your hands were freed from the basket.

Psalm 81:7 In distress you called, and I delivered you; I answered you in the secret place of thunder; I tested you at the waters of Meribah. Selah

Psalm 81:8 Hear, O my people, while I admonish you! O Israel, if you would but listen to me!

Psalm 81:9 There shall be no strange god among you; you shall not bow down to a foreign god.

Psalm 81:10 I am the Lord your God, who brought you up out of the land of Egypt. Open your mouth wide, and I will fill it.

Psalm 81:11 "But my people did not listen to my voice; Israel would not submit to me.

Psalm 81:12 So I gave them over to their stubborn hearts, to follow their own counsels.

Psalm 81:13 Oh, that my people would listen to me, that Israel would walk in my ways!

Psalm 81:14 I would soon subdue their enemies and turn my hand against their foes.

Psalm 81:15 Those who hate the Lord would cringe toward him, and their fate would last forever.

Psalm 81:16 But he would feed you with the finest of the wheat, and with honey from the rock I would satisfy you."

Psalm 82:1 God has taken his place in the divine council; in the midst of the gods he holds judgment:

Psalm 82:2 "How long will you judge unjustly and show partiality to the wicked? Selah

Psalm 82:3 Give justice to the weak and the fatherless; maintain the right of the afflicted and the destitute.

Psalm 82:4 Rescue the weak and the needy; deliver them from the hand of the wicked."

Psalm 82:5 They have neither knowledge nor understanding, they walk about in darkness; all the foundations of the earth are shaken.

Psalm 82:6 I said, "You are gods, sons of the Most High, all of you;

Psalm 82:7 nevertheless, like men you shall die, and fall like any prince."

Psalm 82:8 Arise, O God, judge the earth; for you shall inherit all the nations!

Psalm 83:1 O God, do not keep silence; do not hold your peace or be still, O God!

Psalm 83:2 For behold, your enemies make an uproar; those who hate you have raised their heads.

Psalm 83:3 They lay crafty plans against your people; they consult together against your treasured ones.

Psalm 83:4 They say, "Come, let us wipe them out as a nation; let the name of Israel be remembered no more!"

Psalm 83:5 For they conspire with one accord; against you they make a covenant-

Psalm 83:6 the tents of Edom and the Ishmaelites, Moab and the Hagrites,

Psalm 83:7 Gebal and Ammon and Amalek, Philistia with the inhabitants of Tyre;

Psalm 83:8 Asshur also has joined them; they are the strong arm of the children of Lot. Selah

Psalm 83:9 Do to them as you did to Midian, as to Sisera and Jabin at the river Kishon,

Psalm 83:10 who were destroyed at En-dor, who became dung for the ground.

Psalm 83:11 Make their nobles like Oreb and Zeeb, all their princes like Zebah and Zalmunna,

Psalm 83:12 who said, "Let us take possession for ourselves of the pastures of God."

Psalm 83:13 O my God, make them like whirling dust, like chaff before the wind.

Psalm 83:14 As fire consumes the forest, as the flame sets the mountains ablaze,

Psalm 83:15 so may you pursue them with your tempest and terrify them with your hurricane!

Psalm 83:16 Fill their faces with shame, that they may seek your name, O Lord.

Psalm 83:17 Let them be put to shame and dismayed forever; let them perish in disgrace,

Psalm 83:18 that they may know that you alone, whose name is the Lord, are the Most High over all the earth.

Psalm 84:1 How lovely is your dwelling place, O Lord of hosts!

Psalm 84:2 My soul longs, yes, faints for the courts of the Lord; my heart and flesh sing for joy to the living God.

Psalm 84:3 Even the sparrow finds a home, and the swallow a nest for herself, where she may lay her young, at your altars, O Lord of hosts, my King and my God.

Psalm 84:4 Blessed are those who dwell in your house, ever singing your praise! Selah

Psalm 84:5 Blessed are those whose strength is in you, in whose heart are the highways to Zion.

Psalm 84:6 As they go through the Valley of Baca they make it a place of springs; the early rain also covers it with pools.

Psalm 84:7 They go from strength to strength; each one appears before God in Zion.

Psalm 84:8 O Lord God of hosts, hear my prayer; give ear, O God of Jacob! Selah

Psalm 84:9 Behold our shield, O God; look on the face of your anointed!

Psalm 84:10 For a day in your courts is better than a thousand elsewhere. I would rather be a doorkeeper in the house of my God than dwell in the tents of wickedness.

Psalm 84:11 For the Lord God is a sun and shield; the Lord bestows favor and honor. No good thing does he withhold from those who walk uprightly.

Psalm 84:12 O Lord of hosts, blessed is the one who trusts in you!

Psalm 85:1 Lord, you were favorable to your land; you restored the fortunes of Jacob.

Psalm 85:2 You forgave the iniquity of your people; you covered all their sin. Selah

Psalm 85:3 You withdrew all your wrath; you turned from your hot anger.

Psalm 85:4 Restore us again, O God of our salvation, and put away your indignation toward us!

Psalm 85:5 Will you be angry with us forever? Will you prolong your anger to all generations?

Psalm 85:6 Will you not revive us again, that your people may rejoice in you?

Psalm 85:7 Show us your steadfast love, O Lord, and grant us your salvation.

Psalm 85:8 Let me hear what God the Lord will speak, for he will speak peace to his people, to his saints; but let them not turn back to folly.

Psalm 85:9 Surely his salvation is near to those who fear him, that glory may dwell in our land.

Psalm 85:10 Steadfast love and faithfulness meet; righteousness and peace kiss each other.

Psalm 85:11 Faithfulness springs up from the ground, and righteousness looks down from the sky.

Psalm 85:12 Yes, the Lord will give what is good, and our land will yield its increase.

Psalm 85:13 Righteousness will go before him and make his footsteps a way.

Psalm 86:1 Incline your ear, O Lord, and answer me, for I am poor and needy.

Psalm 86:2 Preserve my life, for I am godly; save your servant, who trusts in you- you are my God.

Psalm 86:3 Be gracious to me, O Lord, for to you do I cry all the day.

Psalm 86:4 Gladden the soul of your servant, for to you, O Lord, do I lift up my soul.

Psalm 86:5 For you, O Lord, are good and forgiving, abounding in steadfast love to all who call upon you.

Psalm 86:6 Give ear, O Lord, to my prayer; listen to my plea for grace.

Psalm 86:7 In the day of my trouble I call upon you, for you answer me.

Psalm 86:8 There is none like you among the gods, O Lord, nor are there any works like yours.

Psalm 86:9 All the nations you have made shall come and worship before you, O Lord, and shall glorify your name.

Psalm 86:10 For you are great and do wondrous things; you alone are God.

Psalm 86:11 Teach me your way, O Lord, that I may walk in your truth; unite my heart to fear your name.

Psalm 86:12 I give thanks to you, O Lord my God, with my whole heart, and I will glorify your name forever.

Psalm 86:13 For great is your steadfast love toward me; you have delivered my soul from the depths of Sheol.

Psalm 86:14 O God, insolent men have risen up against me; a band of ruthless men seek my life, and they do not set you before them.

Psalm 86:15 But you, O Lord, are a God merciful and gracious, slow to anger and abounding in steadfast love and faithfulness.

Psalm 86:16 Turn to me and be gracious to me; give your strength to your servant, and save the son of your maidservant.

Psalm 86:17 Show me a sign of your favor, that those who hate me may see and be put to shame because you, Lord, have helped me and comforted me.

Psalm 87:1 On the holy mount stands the city he founded;

Psalm 87:2 the Lord loves the gates of Zion more than all the dwelling places of Jacob.

Psalm 87:3 Glorious things of you are spoken, O city of God. Selah

Psalm 87:4 Among those who know me I mention Rahab and Babylon; behold, Philistia and Tyre, with Cush-
"This one was born there," they say.

Psalm 87:5 And of Zion it shall be said, "This one and that one were born in her"; for the Most High himself will establish her.

Psalm 87:6 The Lord records as he registers the peoples, "This one was born there." Selah

Psalm 87:7 Singers and dancers alike say, "All my springs are in you."

Psalm 88:1 O Lord, God of my salvation; I cry out day and night before you.

Psalm 88:2 Let my prayer come before you; incline your ear to my cry!

Psalm 88:3 For my soul is full of troubles, and my life draws near to Sheol.

Psalm 88:4 I am counted among those who go down to the pit; I am a man who has no strength,

Psalm 88:5 like one set loose among the dead, like the slain that lie in the grave, like those whom you remember no more, for they are cut off from your hand.

Psalm 88:6 You have put me in the depths of the pit, in the regions dark and deep.

Psalm 88:7 Your wrath lies heavy upon me, and you overwhelm me with all your waves. Selah

Psalm 88:8 You have caused my companions to shun me; you have made me a horror to them. I am shut in so that I cannot escape;

Psalm 88:9 my eye grows dim through sorrow. Every day I call upon you, O Lord; I spread out my hands to you.

Psalm 88:10 Do you work wonders for the dead? Do the departed rise up to praise you? Selah

Psalm 88:11 Is your steadfast love declared in the grave, or your faithfulness in Abaddon?

Psalm 88:12 Are your wonders known in the darkness, or your righteousness in the land of forgetfulness?

Psalm 88:13 But I, O Lord, cry to you; in the morning my prayer comes before you.

Psalm 88:14 O Lord, why do you cast my soul away? Why do you hide your face from me?

Psalm 88:15 Afflicted and close to death from my youth up, I suffer your terrors; I am helpless.

Psalm 88:16 Your wrath has swept over me; your dreadful assaults destroy me.

Psalm 88:17 They surround me like a flood all day long; they close in on me together.

Psalm 88:18 You have caused my beloved and my friend to shun me; my companions have become darkness.

Psalm 89:1 I will sing of the steadfast love of the Lord, forever; with my mouth I will make known your faithfulness to all generations.

Psalm 89:2 For I said, "Steadfast love will be built up forever; in the heavens you will establish your faithfulness."

Psalm 89:3 You have said, "I have made a covenant with my chosen one; I have sworn to David my servant:

Psalm 89:4 'I will establish your offspring forever, and build your throne for all generations.'" Selah

Psalm 89:5 Let the heavens praise your wonders, O Lord, your faithfulness in the assembly of the holy ones!

Psalm 89:6 For who in the skies can be compared to the Lord? Who among the heavenly beings is like the Lord,

Psalm 89:7 a God greatly to be feared in the council of the holy ones, and awesome above all who are around him?

Psalm 89:8 O Lord God of hosts, who is mighty as you are, O Lord, with your faithfulness all around you?

Psalm 89:9 You rule the raging of the sea; when its waves rise, you still them.

Psalm 89:10 You crushed Rahab like a carcass; you scattered your enemies with your mighty arm.

Psalm 89:11 The heavens are yours; the earth also is yours; the world and all that is in it, you have founded them.

Psalm 89:12 The north and the south, you have created them; Tabor and Hermon joyously praise your name.

Psalm 89:13 You have a mighty arm; strong is your hand, high your right hand.

Psalm 89:14 Righteousness and justice are the foundation of your throne; steadfast love and faithfulness go before you.

Psalm 89:15 Blessed are the people who know the festal shout, who walk, O Lord, in the light of your face,

Psalm 89:16 who exult in your name all the day and in your righteousness are exalted.

Psalm 89:17 For you are the glory of their strength; by your favor our horn is exalted.

Psalm 89:18 For our shield belongs to the Lord, our king to the Holy One of Israel.

Psalm 89:19 Of old you spoke in a vision to your godly one, and said: "I have granted help to one who is mighty; I have exalted one chosen from the people.

Psalm 89:20 I have found David, my servant; with my holy oil I have anointed him,

Psalm 89:21 so that my hand shall be established with him; my arm also shall strengthen him.

Psalm 89:22 The enemy shall not outwit him; the wicked shall not humble him.

Psalm 89:23 I will crush his foes before him and strike down those who hate him.

Psalm 89:24 My faithfulness and my steadfast love shall be with him, and in my name shall his horn be exalted.

Psalm 89:25 I will set his hand on the sea and his right hand on the rivers.

Psalm 89:26 He shall cry to me, 'You are my Father, my God, and the Rock of my salvation.'

Psalm 89:27 And I will make him the firstborn, the highest of the kings of the earth.

Psalm 89:28 My steadfast love I will keep for him forever, and my covenant will stand firm for him.

Psalm 89:29 I will establish his offspring forever and his throne as the days of the heavens.

Psalm 89:30 If his children forsake my law and do not walk according to my rules,

Psalm 89:31 if they violate my statutes and do not keep my commandments,

Psalm 89:32 then I will punish their transgression with the rod and their iniquity with stripes,

Psalm 89:33 but I will not remove from him my steadfast love or be false to my faithfulness.

Psalm 89:34 I will not violate my covenant or alter the word that went forth from my lips.

Psalm 89:35 Once for all I have sworn by my holiness; I will not lie to David.

Psalm 89:36 His offspring shall endure forever, his throne as long as the sun before me.

Psalm 89:37 Like the moon it shall be established forever, a faithful witness in the skies." Selah

Psalm 89:38 But now you have cast off and rejected; you are full of wrath against your anointed.

Psalm 89:39 You have renounced the covenant with your servant; you have defiled his crown in the dust.

Psalm 89:40 You have breached all his walls; you have laid his strongholds in ruins.

Psalm 89:41 All who pass by plunder him; he has become the scorn of his neighbors.

Psalm 89:42 You have exalted the right hand of his foes; you have made all his enemies rejoice.

Psalm 89:43 You have also turned back the edge of his sword, and you have not made him stand in battle.

Psalm 89:44 You have made his splendor to cease and cast his throne to the ground.

Psalm 89:45 You have cut short the days of his youth; you have covered him with shame. Selah

Psalm 89:46 How long, O Lord? Will you hide yourself forever? How long will your wrath burn like fire?

Psalm 89:47 Remember how short my time is! For what vanity you have created all the children of man!

Psalm 89:48 What man can live and never see death? Who can deliver his soul from the power of Sheol? Selah

Psalm 89:49 Lord, where is your steadfast love of old, which by your faithfulness you swore to David?

Psalm 89:50 Remember, O Lord, how your servants are mocked, and how I bear in my heart the insults of all the many nations,

Psalm 89:51 with which your enemies mock, O Lord, with which they mock the footsteps of your anointed.

Psalm 89:52 Blessed be the Lord forever! Amen and Amen.

Psalm 90:1 Lord, you have been our dwelling place in all generations.

Psalm 90:2 Before the mountains were brought forth, or ever you had formed the earth and the world, from everlasting to everlasting you are God.

Psalm 90:3 You return man to dust and say, "Return, O children of man!"

Psalm 90:4 For a thousand years in your sight are but as yesterday when it is past, or as a watch in the night.

Psalm 90:5 You sweep them away as with a flood; they are like a dream, like grass that is renewed in the morning:

Psalm 90:6 in the morning it flourishes and is renewed; in the evening it fades and withers.

Psalm 90:7 For we are brought to an end by your anger; by your wrath we are dismayed.

Psalm 90:8 You have set our iniquities before you, our secret sins in the light of your presence.

Psalm 90:9 For all our days pass away under your wrath; we bring our years to an end like a sigh.

Psalm 90:10 The years of our life are seventy, or even by reason of strength eighty; yet their span is but toil and trouble; they are soon gone, and we fly away.

Psalm 90:11 Who considers the power of your anger, and your wrath according to the fear of you?

Psalm 90:12 So teach us to number our days that we may get a heart of wisdom.

Psalm 90:13 Return, O Lord! How long? Have pity on your servants!

Psalm 90:14 Satisfy us in the morning with your steadfast love, that we may rejoice and be glad all our days.

Psalm 90:15 Make us glad for as many days as you have afflicted us, and for as many years as we have seen evil.

Psalm 90:16 Let your work be shown to your servants, and your glorious power to their children.

Psalm 90:17 Let the favor of the Lord our God be upon us, and establish the work of our hands upon us; yes, establish the work of our hands!

Psalm 91:1 He who dwells in the shelter of the Most High will abide in the shadow of the Almighty.

Psalm 91:2 I will say to the Lord, "My refuge and my fortress, my God, in whom I trust."

Psalm 91:3 For he will deliver you from the snare of the fowler and from the deadly pestilence.

Psalm 91:4 He will cover you with his pinions, and under his wings you will find refuge; his faithfulness is a shield and buckler.

Psalm 91:5 You will not fear the terror of the night, nor the arrow that flies by day,

Psalm 91:6 nor the pestilence that stalks in darkness, nor the destruction that wastes at noonday.

Psalm 91:7 A thousand may fall at your side, ten thousand at your right hand, but it will not come near you.

Psalm 91:8 You will only look with your eyes and see the recompense of the wicked.

Psalm 91:9 Because you have made the Lord your dwelling place- the Most High, who is my refuge-

Psalm 91:10 no evil shall be allowed to befall you, no plague come near your tent.

Psalm 91:11 For he will command his angels concerning you to guard you in all your ways.

Psalm 91:12 On their hands they will bear you up, lest you strike your foot against a stone.

Psalm 91:13 You will tread on the lion and the adder; the young lion and the serpent you will trample underfoot.

Psalm 91:14 "Because he holds fast to me in love, I will deliver him; I will protect him, because he knows my name.

Psalm 91:15 When he calls to me, I will answer him; I will be with him in trouble; I will rescue him and honor him.

Psalm 91:16 With long life I will satisfy him and show him my salvation."

Psalm 92:1 It is good to give thanks to the Lord, to sing praises to your name, O Most High;

Psalm 92:2 to declare your steadfast love in the morning, and your faithfulness by night,

Psalm 92:3 to the music of the lute and the harp, to the melody of the lyre.

Psalm 92:4 For you, O Lord, have made me glad by your work; at the works of your hands I sing for joy.

Psalm 92:5 How great are your works, O Lord! Your thoughts are very deep!

Psalm 92:6 The stupid man cannot know; the fool cannot understand this:

Psalm 92:7 that though the wicked sprout like grass and all evildoers flourish, they are doomed to destruction forever;

Psalm 92:8 but you, O Lord, are on high forever.

Psalm 92:9 For behold, your enemies, O Lord, for behold, your enemies shall perish; all evildoers shall be scattered.

Psalm 92:10 But you have exalted my horn like that of the wild ox; you have poured over me fresh oil.

Psalm 92:11 My eyes have seen the downfall of my enemies; my ears have heard the doom of my evil assailants.

Psalm 92:12 The righteous flourish like the palm tree and grow like a cedar in Lebanon.

Psalm 92:13 They are planted in the house of the Lord; they flourish in the courts of our God.

Psalm 92:14 They still bear fruit in old age; they are ever full of sap and green,

Psalm 92:15 to declare that the Lord is upright; he is my rock, and there is no unrighteousness in him.

Psalm 93:1 The Lord reigns; he is robed in majesty; the Lord is robed; he has put on strength as his belt. Yes, the world is established; it shall never be moved.

Psalm 93:2 Your throne is established from of old; you are from everlasting.

Psalm 93:3 The floods have lifted up, O Lord, the floods have lifted up their voice; the floods lift up their roaring.

Psalm 93:4 Mightier than the thunders of many waters, mightier than the waves of the sea, the Lord on high is mighty!

Psalm 93:5 Your decrees are very trustworthy; holiness befits your house, O Lord, forevermore.

Psalm 94:1 O Lord, God of vengeance, O God of vengeance, shine forth!

Psalm 94:2 Rise up, O judge of the earth; repay to the proud what they deserve!

Psalm 94:3 O Lord, how long shall the wicked, how long shall the wicked exult?

Psalm 94:4 They pour out their arrogant words; all the evildoers boast.

Psalm 94:5 They crush your people, O Lord, and afflict your heritage.

Psalm 94:6 They kill the widow and the sojourner, and murder the fatherless;

Psalm 94:7 and they say, "The Lord does not see; the God of Jacob does not perceive."

Psalm 94:8 Understand, O dullest of the people! Fools, when will you be wise?

Psalm 94:9 He who planted the ear, does he not hear? He who formed the eye, does he not see?

Psalm 94:10 He who disciplines the nations, does he not rebuke? He who teaches man knowledge-

Psalm 94:11 the Lord- knows the thoughts of man, that they are but a breath.

Psalm 94:12 Blessed is the man whom you discipline, O Lord, and whom you teach out of your law,

Psalm 94:13 to give him rest from days of trouble, until a pit is dug for the wicked.

Psalm 94:14 For the Lord will not forsake his people; he will not abandon his heritage;

Psalm 94:15 for justice will return to the righteous, and all the upright in heart will follow it.

Psalm 94:16 Who rises up for me against the wicked? Who stands up for me against evildoers?

Psalm 94:17 If the Lord had not been my help, my soul would soon have lived in the land of silence.

Psalm 94:18 When I thought, "My foot slips," your steadfast love, O Lord, held me up.

Psalm 94:19 When the cares of my heart are many, your consolations cheer my soul.

Psalm 94:20 Can wicked rulers be allied with you, those who frame injustice by statute?

Psalm 94:21 They band together against the life of the righteous and condemn the innocent to death.

Psalm 94:22 But the Lord has become my stronghold, and my God the rock of my refuge.

Psalm 94:23 He will bring back on them their iniquity and wipe them out for their wickedness; the Lord our God will wipe them out.

Psalm 95:1 Oh come, let us sing to the Lord; let us make a joyful noise to the rock of our salvation!

Psalm 95:2 Let us come into his presence with thanksgiving; let us make a joyful noise to him with songs of praise!

Psalm 95:3 For the Lord is a great God, and a great King above all gods.

Psalm 95:4 In his hand are the depths of the earth; the heights of the mountains are his also.

Psalm 95:5 The sea is his, for he made it, and his hands formed the dry land.

Psalm 95:6 Oh come, let us worship and bow down; let us kneel before the Lord, our Maker!

Psalm 95:7 For he is our God, and we are the people of his pasture, and the sheep of his hand. Today, if you hear his voice,

Psalm 95:8 do not harden your hearts, as at Meribah, as on the day at Massah in the wilderness,

Psalm 95:9 when your fathers put me to the test and put me to the proof, though they had seen my work.

Psalm 95:10 For forty years I loathed that generation and said, "They are a people who go astray in their heart, and they have not known my ways."

Psalm 95:11 Therefore I swore in my wrath, "They shall not enter my rest."

Psalm 96:1 Oh sing to the Lord a new song; sing to the Lord, all the earth!

Psalm 96:2 Sing to the Lord, bless his name; tell of his salvation from day to day.

Psalm 96:3 Declare his glory among the nations, his marvelous works among all the peoples!

Psalm 96:4 For great is the Lord, and greatly to be praised; he is to be feared above all gods.

Psalm 96:5 For all the gods of the peoples are worthless idols, but the Lord made the heavens.

Psalm 96:6 Splendor and majesty are before him; strength and beauty are in his sanctuary.

Psalm 96:9 Worship the Lord in the splendor of holiness; tremble before him, all the earth!

Psalm 96:10 Say among the nations, "The Lord reigns! Yes, the world is established; it shall never be moved; he will judge the peoples with equity."

Psalm 96:11 Let the heavens be glad, and let the earth rejoice; let the sea roar, and all that fills it;

Psalm 96:12 let the field exult, and everything in it! Then shall all the trees of the forest sing for joy

Psalm 96:13 before the Lord, for he comes, for he comes to judge the earth. He will judge the world in righteousness, and the peoples in his faithfulness.

Psalm 97:1 The Lord reigns, let the earth rejoice; let the many coastlands be glad!

Psalm 97:2 Clouds and thick darkness are all around him; righteousness and justice are the foundation of his throne.

Psalm 97:3 Fire goes before him and burns up his adversaries all around.

Psalm 97:4 His lightnings light up the world; the earth sees and trembles.

Psalm 97:5 The mountains melt like wax before the Lord, before the Lord of all the earth.

Psalm 97:6 The heavens proclaim his righteousness, and all the peoples see his glory.

Psalm 97:7 All worshipers of images are put to shame, who make their boast in worthless idols; worship him, all you gods!

Psalm 97:8 Zion hears and is glad, and the daughters of Judah rejoice, because of your judgments, O Lord.

Psalm 97:9 For you, O Lord, are most high over all the earth; you are exalted far above all gods.

Psalm 97:10 O you who love the Lord, hate evil! He preserves the lives of his saints; he delivers them from the hand of the wicked.

Psalm 97:11 Light is sown for the righteous, and joy for the upright in heart.

Psalm 97:12 Rejoice in the Lord, O you righteous, and give thanks to his holy name!

Psalm 98:1 Oh sing to the Lord a new song, for he has done marvelous things! His right hand and his holy arm have worked salvation for him.

Psalm 98:2 The Lord has made known his salvation; he has revealed his righteousness in the sight of the nations.

Psalm 98:3 He has remembered his steadfast love and faithfulness to the house of Israel. All the ends of the earth have seen the salvation of our God.

Psalm 98:4 Make a joyful noise to the Lord, all the earth; break forth into joyous song and sing praises!

Psalm 98:5 Sing praises to the Lord with the lyre, with the lyre and the sound of melody!

Psalm 98:6 With trumpets and the sound of the horn make a joyful noise before the King, the Lord!

Psalm 98:7 Let the sea roar, and all that fills it; the world and those who dwell in it!

Psalm 98:8 Let the rivers clap their hands; let the hills sing for joy together

Psalm 98:9 before the Lord, for he comes to judge the earth. He will judge the world with righteousness, and the peoples with equity.

Psalm 99:1 The Lord reigns; let the peoples tremble! He sits enthroned upon the cherubim; let the earth quake!

Psalm 99:2 The Lord is great in Zion; he is exalted over all the peoples.

Psalm 99:3 Let them praise your great and awesome name! Holy is he!
